How to reinstall or repair Internet Explorer in Windows.

The Internet Explorer 11 desktop application will be retired and go out of support on June 15, 2022 (for a list of what's in scope, see the FAQ). The same IE11 apps and sites you use today can open in Microsoft Edge with Internet Explorer mode. [Learn more here.](#)

If you experience a recurring problem when you use Internet Explorer in Windows, you may try to repair or reinstall the program to fix the problem. Although this may sound intimidating, this article offers the most direct, trouble-free methods to perform this task.

Repair Internet Explorer in Windows.

You can reset the program settings to repair your Internet Explorer. To do this, use the following procedure:

Exit all programs, including Internet Explorer. Press the Windows logo key+R to open the Run box. Type inetpl.cpl and select OK . The Internet Options dialog box appears. Select the Advanced tab. Under Reset Internet Explorer settings, select Reset . Then select Reset again. Select the Delete personal settings check box if you also want to remove browsing history, search providers, Accelerators, home pages, Tracking Protection, and ActiveX Filtering data. When Internet Explorer finishes resetting the settings, select Close in the Reset Internet Explorer Settings dialog box. Start Internet Explorer again.

Reinstall Internet Explorer in Windows.

Windows 8.1 and Windows 10.

You can use the System File Checker tool to repair missing or corrupted system files to validate the corresponding system files.

Windows 7, Windows Server 2008 R2, Windows Vista, and Windows Server 2008 SP2.

Step 1: Download Internet Explorer that can be installed on your Operating system using the following table as guidance.

Windows version	Internet Explorer version that can be installed
Windows 7, Windows Server 2008 R2	Download Internet Explorer 11 (Offline installer)
Windows Vista, Windows Server 2008 SP2	Windows Internet Explorer 9 (64 Bit) - Windows Internet Explorer 9 (32 Bit)

Step 2: Uninstall the version of Internet Explorer that you may have installed on top of Internet Explorer 8.0 (For Windows Vista it is Internet Explorer 7.0) that natively ships with and installed as part of the operating system.

Internet Explorer 8.0 (or Internet Explorer 7.0 on Vista) will continue to exist even after you uninstall newer versions.

Use the following procedure to remove Internet Explorer:

On the Start page, choose Control Panel , and then choose Programs and Features .

Under Programs and Features , select View installed updates on left pane.

Under Uninstall an update list, select applicable Internet Explorer version from the list (Internet Explorer 11 or Windows Internet Explorer 9) and select Yes to confirm uninstallation and restart your system to complete the process.

Step 3: Install the version of Internet Explorer that you downloaded in Step 1 and restart the system after installation.

After you reinstall Internet Explorer, run Windows Update to apply any available updates for Internet Explorer.

Windows 10 Offline Installer.

Windows 10 has been the best and the most admired upgrade by Microsoft. After its launch, Microsoft has progressively started the OTA update process. If you are using Windows 10 on your PC, Windows Update tool is the only way Microsoft pushes its updates to your PC. Currently, this tool hasn't matured at all as it has various loop-holes i.e. slow update process and random errors, which create problems for its users. On the other hand, you might be moving to a place where there is no internet available but you want to upgrade your Windows 10 to the latest version. In order to cope with this issue, you might be thinking of going for an offline installer for Windows 10 without spending any penny. In that case, you have landed on the right place.

What is Windows 10 Offline Installer?

Windows 10 offline installer is exactly an ISO file containing all the essential files of the OS. So, you can download this ISO file and create a Windows 10 bootable media using the Appuals way.

How to Download Windows 10 Offline Installer?

As of now, Windows 10 offline installer isn't directly available at Microsoft's website but we have found a way to download. To do so, follow these steps.

You need to have Google Chrome installed on your PC. You can download it from this link . Any other browser like Firefox or Opera wouldn't work in this case.

Open Google Chrome and navigate to this link. At this moment, it wouldn't be displaying any option to download Windows 10.

On this page, launch the Google Chrome Console by pressing "Ctrl + Shift + J" keys on your keyboard. At the top left of the Console window, there is a device icon as illustrated in the image below. Click on this icon and it would turn the website into Mobile Responsive Mode . From here, you can select the size of website from a drop down list. Press F5 on your keyboard after selecting the size of website in order to refresh the website.

After refreshing the page, you will come up with an option to select the edition of Windows 10. Select Windows 10 from the drop down list and click on the Confirm button.

After confirming the edition of Windows, scroll down the window and you will see an option to select the language along with another Confirm button. Do select your preferred language and click on Confirm button.

Next is the last step to download offline installer for Windows 10. You need to select from two variants of Windows 10 i.e. 32-Bit and 64-Bit . Select your version based on your system specifications and it would start downloading the ISO file (Offline Installer).

I need to install IE 9 or IE 10 on a Windows Server 2008 R2. IE 9 or 10 is specified because of compatibility with some of our applications that have been developed in house.

An earlier post listed the link <http://download.microsoft.com/download/8/A/C/8AC7C482-BC74-492E-B978-7ED04900CEDE/IE10-Windows6.1-x86-en-us.exe> as a source for the IE 10 download, but when I downloaded it and tried to install it, I got an error "Operating System is not supported".

I am hesitant to download it from one of the non-microsoft sites that offer it.

Where is IE10 standalone installer?

Someone pointed to this site: <http://windows.microsoft.com/en-US/internet-explorer/download-ie>, but there is only a net installer (a full install would be 20-40MB, not 800K).

More helpful would be IE10+ the needed updates all in a \*tar\* file so I could just extract them and reboot, since for now, get install failed messages for most of the updates -- but I have a feeling that if it replaced the files that were there with new ones, it would work.

As it is, I get messages like:

the ordinal 139 could not be located in the dynamic link library iertutil.dll.

I have tried going into programs+features and turning off IE, and back on, but the "turn off" fails and it can't be removed (so it can't be reinstalled). Note, the IE9 standalone installer won't work, as it detects a newer version already on my computer (later version of IE9, likely).

It's too bad "sfc" was apparently dumbed down to no longer be able to ask for the install CD(DVD) or go online and download the necessary files to replace corrupt ones. Instead it just comes back and says, sorry, I couldn't repair everything. Reboot to have the repairs take effect. (which don't seem to make a difference). Running sfc again after reboot doesn't improve the situation.

Most programs work, but some things are not working without some version of IE installed & working (trying to run IE does either 1) nothing), or 2) flashes a browser window which then goes away.

Internet Explorer 10 Download.

Here is my problem: My company requires Internet Explorer 10 to be installed on company machines and cannot be IE 11, Microsoft has virtually destroyed all download links for IE 10 and for the ones they haven't destroyed they are broken (404).

The only way we can get IE 10 is by uninstalling IE 11 and downgrading to the last version that was installed which is usually IE 9 then searching

for IE 10 via Windows update. This can take hours and in most cases we cannot take a machine for that long from our users.

Does Microsoft provide a standalone installer for IE 10? if not, why can we get it via windows update?
