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What can I do to prevent this in the future?

If you are on a personal connection, like at home, you can run an anti-virus scan on your device to make sure it is not infected with malware.

If you are at an office or shared network, you can ask the network administrator to run a scan across the network looking for misconfigured or infected devices.

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DeepNude's makers tried to deep-six their pervy AI app. Web creeps have other ideas: Cracked copies shared online as code decompiled.

This genie is definitely not going back in the bottle.

From the department of closing the barn door after the horse has warped away at light speed, comes this latest news. Although the creators of DeepNude have torn down their slimy software that removes clothes from women in photos, the code continues to spread all over the internet.

Some devs are even trying to reverse-engineer the application to produce their own improved builds, or release it as open source.

The original version of DeepNude – a machine-learning app that replaced women's clothing in photos with an approximation of what they would look like underneath, thus creating fake naked images of them – was seemingly abandoned last week after its developers, based in Estonia, realized, with the help of some online outrage, that their misogynistic creation could be misused. They took down their website, halted any further downloads and activations, and asked people to forget the whole affair, all within a few days of launching the thing.

“Downloading the software from other sources or sharing it by any other means would be against the terms of our website. From now on, DeepNude will not release other versions and does not grant anyone its use,” the coders said last week. Some in the AI world sighed with relief that the photo menace had gone almost as soon as it had arrived.

I'm glad DeepNude is dead. As a person and as a father, I thought this was one of the most disgusting applications of AI. To the AI Community: You have superpowers, and what you build matters. Please use your powers on worthy projects that move the world forward. — Andrew Ng (@AndrewYNg) June 28, 2019.

However, funnily enough, the team's halfhearted plea hasn't stopped this software nasty from spreading nor stopped people using it. The application, available for Windows, Linux, and Android, was downloaded by hordes of internet pervs, who are now sharing the packages on file-sharing networks.

A Reg reader tipped us off that hundreds of users are slinging cracked copies of the premium version of DeepNude, which cost \$50 apiece, around file-sharing sites and networks: a number of copies, unsurprisingly, contain malware. And that's not all. Details on how to use the software, along with links to downloads, are being shared on YouTube, and versions sold in shady Bitcoin forums and touted across Discord, an instant-chat platform popular with geeks and gamers.

It appears programmers have fixed various bugs – the software was known to be crashtastic – and removed the automatic placing of watermarks on generated images. These marks labeled the doctored photos as "fake."

The Register poked around a few of these Discord servers. “We are happy to announce that we have the complete and clean version of DeepNude V2 and cracked the software and are making adjustments to improve the program,” announced one we found to its thousands of members.

The above message also appeared on another Discord server that was shut down on Monday, as reported by Vice. Another DeepNude-touting server we saw was home to more than 20,000 netizens eager to get hold of the software.

"The sharing of non-consensual pornography is explicitly prohibited in our terms of service and community guidelines," a Discord spokesperson told The Register .

"We will investigate and take immediate action against any reported terms of service violation by a server or user. Non-consensual pornography warrants an instant shut down on the servers and ban of the users whenever we identify it."

Cracking DeepNude.

You don't have to look far to find decompiled versions of the neural-network software, either, revealing in part the internal workings of the application. Coders have been reverse engineering the original DeepNude software, or building their own flavors from scratch after studying its operation, and posting their results on GitHub, for instance.

It appears DeepNude was written in Python that was subsequently compiled into executable binaries. It uses PyTorch, Qt, Numpy, and various other libraries to achieve its goal, and can accelerate its image generation using Nvidia GPUs via CUDA. The software's trained model is split over three files, totaling 2.1GB, that, in normal use, are downloaded once from a since-deactivated AWS S3 bucket after the app is installed. Copies of the software floating around file-sharing networks include this trained model so it can be used despite the cloud bucket deactivation.

Interestingly, the code slightly alters its data three times in an obfuscated manner, replacing short strings of bytes, before using it, probably to prevent other applications from using its trained model.

Its algorithms are based on pix2pix, a generative adversarial networks research project run by boffins at the University of California, Berkeley back in 2017. This image-to-image technology – described in more detail here – generates new pictures from input photos or sketches, drawing upon on its training data to paint the scene. For example, pix2pix can be trained to turn outlines of cats into fully rendered AI-generated cats, or black and white images into color snaps.

In the case of DeepNude, however, it's bikinis to boobs.

The neural network would, we imagine, be trained on thousands of pairs of images: for each pair, one would be a woman in a swimsuit, and the other ideally the same woman naked in a similar pose. The model learns the outline and shape of women's bodies, and what they should look like underneath. When it's fed an image of a scantily clad woman, it substitutes the clothing for the naughty bits to make her appear naked. This works particularly well if the input image looks like something akin a modeling shoot, since a lot of the training data will involve pictures taken from porno picture albums.

Ironically, a group of researchers from the Pontifical Catholic University of Rio Grande do Sul, Brazil, built a similar model last year. Instead of removing the clothes, however, it actually pastes them on naked ladies. The DeepNude app, however, acts in reverse, swapping bras for breasts. ®

An unknown programmer created the DeepNude application, which "removes" clothes from photos using social networks. This allows you to make fake, but at the same time quite realistic nude pictures of women. editor checked the operation of the algorithm with a few examples.

Updated: DeepNude has a problem. According to the developers, the failure is associated with a large number of visits. The company promised to restore work within a few days.

Hi! DeepNude is offline. Why? Because we did not expect these visits and our servers need reinforcement. We are a small team. We need to fix some bugs and catch our breath. The first about DeepNude told edition Vice. Journalists called the application the evolution of the ideas of DeepFake, only not in the video, but in the photo. In this new algorithm is much easier to learn – fake photos can be done in just a few clicks.

The application started on June 23. While it works only on Windows and Linux. The developer, who has a profile on Twitter, did not announce further plans. If you believe the completed biography in the account, the author DeepNude lives in Estonia.

Editor downloaded and checked the application. When using it on a "stripped" photo, a huge watermark appears, which closes most of the result of the algorithm. This is solved with the paid version of DeepNude: for \$ 50 instead of a mark, only the "Fake" mark in the corner remains. For \$ 100, the user receives a photo without any signs.

The creator of DeepNude recommends using photos of girls who already have most of their bodies exposed, for example, in a bathing suit or underwear. Also, a editor check showed that the application is sensitive to poses – it's better not to use pictures where the person is standing back or in a half-turn.

In the "ideal" conditions, the algorithm copes with the work qualitatively, filling the areas that are hidden by clothes.

Sometimes the application gives noticeable failures. For example, does not draw the nipples or adds another naked body in a random place. You can also see that in some cases the neural network makes the shape slimmer than on the original.

DeepNudes does not do very well with the drawn characters.

And if you upload a photo of a man, the algorithm will try to substitute the female body under the clothes. For example, on the site of the penis may appear chest. Obviously, the algorithm is not trained on male nude shots.

Vice journalists paid \$ 50 to test the application. They also contacted the developer: he introduced himself as Alberto and said that he had trained the neural network on 10,000 photographs of naked women. According to him, the function of "stripping" men is in his plans.

Alberto noted that he was inspired by the idea of "x-ray glasses" from his childhood.

I'm not a pervert, I'm a technology enthusiast. And I continue to improve the algorithm. Against the background of failures with other startups, I asked myself: can I get an economic return from this? And launched the application. I asked myself if I was doing the right thing. But the same can be done in Photoshop, just in a few hours, and in 30 seconds. This is just a fun experiment. If someone has bad intentions with these photos, then I have nothing to do with it. If not I will do it, then someone else.

Go to the application site and download it – the program works only on Windows and Linux. The site offers an online version, but this is just a demonstration of already processed images; After installation, the algorithm will load the necessary libraries for a few more minutes. After this, DeepNudes will be ready for use; The application has only two buttons: upload a photo and remove watermarks. After uploading a picture, if necessary, enlarge the photo and place the desired person in the center;

4. After about 30 seconds, a "stripped" photo appears. Download it in full resolution for free can not – only with a premium account. But you can make a screenshot.

After the Vice material, Alberto warned that due to the high load, photos can be processed longer. At the same time, human rights organizations have already paid attention to the algorithm, which were outraged by the similar "invasion of a person's private sex life". Vice called the app "terrifying."

The authors of the publication showed DeepNudes a professor of computer science at Berkeley University, Farid Hany (Hany Farid). According to journalists, he was shocked by the simplicity of creating a fake snapshot.

We need to learn to better identify such fakes, and scientists and researchers will often think about how to protect their achievements from such "harmful" use. Social networks, in turn, should carefully discuss how to change the rules to prevent the distribution of such content. Our legislators will also have to think about the adjustment of the "dipface".
