Of course, a note before continuing, if you still do not have the game controller for the Nvidia Shield TV or a compatible one, such as the PS4, you have to get one now. Because only this is how you are going to be able to make the most of your options.

Tips and tricks for squeezing the Nvidia Shield.

We are going to comment with the basic settings and some tricks that you should know to get more out of this Nvidia device.

1. Adjust the intensity of the green LEDs.

Some people find the green LEDs on the device attractive. And yes, they have their point, but it is also true that when the room is completely dark they can get annoying. The brightness level can be varied, just go to System> LED Brightness and adjust it to the value that interests you most. We would opt for low, so that it continues to maintain a little that differentiated point but without disturbing.

2. Processor performance.

The Nvidia Shield TV integrates a Tegra processor, if you are not going to use the device with GeForceNow or do not need it to be at maximum power and performance at all times, in Settings> Processor mode you can adjust between optimized and maximum performance.

3. Copy data from the computer to the Nvidia Shield via USB.

If you go to the System settings > Storage and restart you will see that there is an option that allows you to activate the access to the storage of Nvidia Shield TV through a USB A to USB A cable. Ok, the cable may not be the most popular, but you can buy it from Amazon easily.

When you connect the Nvidia Shield TV to the computer it will appear as another external disk, so you can copy the files you need. A faster option for large files compared to the option to do it over the local network.

4. Customize the home screen.

Like Android TV, you can customize the home screen according to your interests. For example, to show you suggestions for services such as Netflix, YouTube or Play Store applications. From Settings> Home Screen you can adjust what you want to be or not visible.

Within the home screen you will also see settings to automatically organize the applications you use the most . Here it is a matter of taste, if you want to know where each of your apps is at all times, disable this option. If, on the other hand, you like having the most used ones of the last days visible, activate.

5. Installation of applications from unknown sources.

Similarly, when using Android TV you can also decide whether or not you want to allow the installation of applications from unofficial sources. This is important to do when you are clear about the provenance and reliability, if not, our recommendation is not to do it.

To activate this option, in the Settings go to Security and restrictions , activate the Unknown sources option.

6. Control your TV with the Nvidia Shield TV remote.

The HDMI connector of the Nvidia Shield TV offers CEC support , this means that you can control the TV with its remote. To do this, in the Settings, go to the option of Screen and sound and activate the option of Power control (CEC TV). Now when you grab the remote to turn on the Nvidia Shield TV the TV will also turn on if it is in standby mode . In addition to being able to control the volume.

7. Turn off background network search.

On a phone, tablet or computer it can be interesting to be looking for new WiFi networks in the background. But on a device like the Nvidia Shield TV it doesn't make as much sense once you've connected it to your local network via ethernet cable or wirelessly. Because the network

will not change. So, go to the Network settings and disable the option.

RetroArch.

The great classics of 8-bit and 16-bit consoles or arcade machines are perfect for those evenings when you simply want to enjoy proposals that marked the future of video games.

To be able to emulate all these consoles and arcade machines is RetroArch, a real gem that hides in the Play Store . An application as simple to use as download, install and run. Because having the Nvidia Shield TV remote already connected you won't need anything else.

ExpressVPN.

Using VPN networks can be very useful on an Nvidia Shield TV. Thanks to them you can access services that are not available in your country or skip the meaningless limitations that some services sometimes impose.

PlayStation Vue plans start at \$29.99 / month.

Hulu (Plans start at \$7.99 / month)

You may not get to watch The Late Show with Stephen Colbert the night it airs, but it's still pretty funny the next day.

From movies and music to TV shows and pictures, Plex for Android lets you keep your content in one place while streaming it to any manner of data on pretty much any device imaginable.

Kodi (Free)

Kodi users love the ease with which the SHIELD Android TV box lets users stream all of their personal media to their big-screen TV. You can also download hundreds of community-created add-ons that provide access to popular internet streaming media services like Twitch, Vimeo, Vine, SyFy, NFL, Flickr, and more.

SHOWTIME (\$10.99 / month)

The life of the cord-cutter just got a whole lot better thanks to the SHOWTIME app for Android TV. With the SHOWTIME app, cord-cutters can watch whatever is airing live on SHOWTIME or even benefit from on-demand access to every season of every SHOWTIME Original Series. Because binge watching Dexter is always good for your psyche. In addition to TV shows and movies, the SHOWTIME app also lets users watch sports like Showtime Championship Boxing, 60 Minutes Sports and Inside the NFL. Once downloaded users will benefit from a 30-day free trial. After that the service is \$10.99 a month.

SHOWTIME Anytime (Requires subscription through a participating cable or satellite TV provider)

SHOWTIME Anytime is now available on your SHIELD Android TV. Free with your SHOWTIME subscription through participating cable or satellite TV providers, users can now enjoy unlimited on-demand access to full seasons of SHOWTIME original series, movies, sports and comedy. In addition to on-demand content, with Showtime Anytime you can also watch what's currently airing live on SHOWTIME, and easily switch between the SHOWTIME East and SHOWTIME West feeds. Not necessarily a pure cord-cutting app as Showtime Anytime requires a cable or satellite subscription, it's still a great way to extend your cable or satellite experience to your SHIELD Android TV. Showtime Anytime supports the following cable and satellite TV providers: AT&T U-verse, Bright House Networks, Cox Communications, DIRECTV, DISH, Optimum, Time Warner Cable, Verizon FiOS just to name a few.

Twitch Android TV (Free)

With the Twitch for Android app, you can watch broadcasts of the games you love and chat with the players you follow. Whether you're into *The Witcher 3: Wild Hunt*, *Minecraft: Story Mode*, or even *Saints Row IV*, the Twitch viewer app has you covered. Features include: live and recorded video of top games, players and esports events, interactive shows by Riot Games, Blizzard and other developers, full-featured chat, including chat-only mode, even if the channel is offline and the ability to follow channels and games you wanna keep tabs on.

HBO NOW (\$14.99 / month)

A cord-cutter's dream-come-true, HBO NOW doesn't require you have a subscription with a participating cable or satellite TV provider.

HBO GO (Requires subscription through a participating cable or satellite TV provider)

HBO GO is easily one of the most popular streaming services and now it's available on the SHIELD Android TV. Not purely for cord-cutters, HBO GO requires that users already subscribe to HBO through a participating TV provider like Time Warner Cable. Of course HBO GO gives you all of HBO including every season and episode of HBO's original series as well as the latest hit movies. In order to use HBO GO you'll have to log in with the credentials set up through your participating television provider or on hbogo.com. While we're super-excited that HBO GO has made it to the SHIELD Android TV there's one caveat. Currently, Comcast subscribers aren't able to use the service. If this changes we'll be sure to keep you posted.

CBS All Access (\$5.99 / month)

While it's possible to watch your local CBS broadcast in HD with an HD antenna, CBS All Access adds something extra, the ability to watch more than 6,500 episodes of your favorite CBS shows on-demand. New episodes of current shows will be available on-demand the day after their first airing. Of course if the signal from your HD antenna is spotty you can use CBS All Access to actually stream your local CBS broadcast. In addition to current shows, CBS All Access! will also let users watch classic shows like *Star Trek* and *I love Lucy* ad-free. After a one week free trial CBS All Access is \$5.99 a month.

FOX NOW App (Requires subscription through a participating cable or satellite TV provider)

Watch full episodes of your favorite FOX shows the day after they air and binge on the full season of select shows – anytime, anywhere with FOX NOW. Not purely for cord-cutters you'll have to sign in with your TV provider username and password to watch all available episodes from the FOX lineup.

Fox Sports Go (Requires subscription through a participating cable or satellite TV provider)

While plenty cool, Fox Sports Go isn't purely a cord-cutting app as you'll need a proper cable or satellite subscription to use it. That said, we really enjoyed the variety of sports that the channel provided.

Red Bull TV (Free)

Known for their action sports, Red Bull TV is a great place to view everything from motorcycle racing and mountain biking to cliff diving and surfing. The short films and documentaries in particular look amazing when streamed in 4k.

PBS Kids (Free)

Gone are the days of kids' shows coming on only at specific times of the day. Remember Saturday morning cartoons? While kids nowadays expect to be able to watch their favorite shows whenever they're free, this is also a boon for parents as it's now even more easy to keep them occupied. At least with PBS Kids parents can rest assured that the content is good.

Web Browser for Android TV (Free)

Next to apps, cord-cutters know that a capable web browser is a necessity. The Web Browser for Android TV app allows you to navigate the web easily with both your SHIELD remote and SHIELD wireless controller. It supports HTML5 full-screen video streaming and lets you save your favorite web pages.

FXNOW (Requires subscription through a participating cable or satellite TV provider)

Not necessarily designed for cord-cutters, FXNOW requires that its users already subscribe to a cable or satellite provider like AT&T U-verse, Time Warner Cable, DIRECTV or Comcast XFINITY. That said FXNOW does offer on-demand streaming of TV shows and movies from three of FX's networks: FX, FXX and FXM. Get ready to binge-watch *Fargo*, *American Horror Story* and *It's Always Sunny in Philadelphia*.

Disney Movies Anywhere (Free)

When you think about Disney Movies Anywhere, it's easy to picture cartoons and kid-specific content. But that's hardly the case. With the Disney Movies Anywhere app users can purchase Disney, Disney•Pixar, Marvel, and Star Wars movies to add to your digital collection. In addition to that, Disney Movies Anywhere will also let users watch their Disney movie collection on any device wherever you are. You can also download

content locally which is great for road trips and flights. Right now when you sign up you get a digital copy of Monsters, Inc for free.

Pandora (Free)

Music fans have been rocking out to Pandora for years. Boasting a massive catalog of musicians and songs, the free version of Pandora even lets users create up to 100 “personalized” radio stations.

iHeartRadio – Radio & Music (Free)

Some users want more than music and that’s where iHeartRadio – Radio & Music comes in. Unlike other services that are mostly dedicated to music, with iHeartRadio you can easily listen to sports, news, comedy and even your favorite podcasts.

Tellybean TV (Free)

Crystal clear, life-sized video calls on the biggest screen in the house are now possible because SHIELD features webcam support. For example, simply connect a Logitech C270 (720p) or C920 (1080p) USB camera to your SHIELD and use a video conferencing app like Tellybean to call your friends on other Tellybean-compatible TVs or devices.

This NVIDIA SHIELD Review was written by Troy from TROYPOINT after using the device on a regular basis for approximately two years.

This device was purchased by TROYPOINT and not donated by NVIDIA.

The second generation NVIDIA SHIELD is one of the most popular streaming devices on the market, and it is known to be the most powerful Android TV Box available today.

You don't see too many tech products that hold their value as long as the NVIDIA SHIELD has! This Android TV Box has been considered the best streaming device since its original release in 2015.

In 2017, NVIDIA released an updated model which included the same powerful processor. The biggest change was a revised form factor with a smaller size and no microSD slot.

They also released an NVIDIA SHIELD Pro model that includes additional storage. We don't suggest purchasing this as you can add external storage yourself which will be less expensive than the upgrade.

The NVIDIA SHIELD does come with a higher price tag when comparing to other devices, but it is definitely a premium streaming device.

Those who are serious cord-cutters and gamers tend to purchase the NVIDIA SHIELD due to its powerful specs. But, for most people, this device is overkill and you should save your money.

What is an NVIDIA SHIELD?

Prior to diving into a full device review, it's important to understand what exactly the NVIDIA SHIELD is from a general standpoint.

The NVIDIA SHIELD (2nd Generation) is a powerful Android TV Box that serves up hundreds of applications for streaming and gaming purposes, and appeals to a variety of audiences.

This device is for the streamers who want to build a cheap Plex server, cord-cutters, Kodi enthusiasts, regular gamers, and for people who just want as much computing power as they can get.

Important Note: The NVIDIA SHIELD is an Android based TV Box that runs on the Android TV Operation System (OS) unlike most Android TV Boxes that run on the Stock Android OS.

The big difference between these operating systems is that Android TV OS is optimized for television screens, while Stock Android OS is optimized for mobile devices.

We refer to Stock Android OS as “generic Android” because it isn't using the true Android TV operating system. Stock Android OS is seen within most Android TV Boxes such as the X96 Max.

The NVIDIA SHIELD offers some of the best internal specs and features for a TV streaming box. It also comes packaged with a user friendly remote that includes a built-in microphone compatible with Google Assistant.

Listed below are some of the notable specs the NVIDIA SHIELD has to offer:

Note: The NVIDIA SHIELD Pro includes 500GB internal storage, expandable storage via USB or microSD, and IR receiver. As mentioned above, we don't suggest purchasing this due to the fact that you can add your own external storage.

User Interface.

The NVIDIA SHIELD TV offers a great user interface that is extremely user friendly with easy navigation.

If you are familiar with the Android Operating System or have used other Android TV Boxes in the past, then navigating within the NVIDIA SHIELD will be a breeze.

You will instantly notice the variety of applications when first opening the device's interface. There are thousands of apps to choose from within the Google Play Store.

Android Boxes like the NVIDIA SHIELD are perfect for those who use the popular paid services such as Netflix, Amazon Prime, etc. These apps perform much better on Android TV OS compared to Stock Android OS.

Using Google Assistant for voice commands on your remote is another unique feature. Notice the information in the screenshot below when searching for any Movie or TV Show.

What I Like.

The NVIDIA SHIELD is the most powerful Android TV Box on the market today and it has held this honor since its release in 2015.

The Tegra X1 4 processor allows for fast navigation and buffer-free video playback. The powerful CPU in this device also makes it a great gaming platform as well.

The true Android TV operating system is nice because it is built for the 10-foot viewing experience. The user interface is simple to use unlike most generic Android TV Boxes running stock Android.

In my tests of streaming 4K video through YouTube, the NVIDIA SHIELD performed flawlessly. When I pull up the Stats for Nerds window, it shows that only 10 frames were dropped and this was at the beginning of playback which is normal on most streaming devices.

Absolutely no problems at all streaming 4K with my VPN on!

Sideload applications that aren't available through Google Play Store is easy to do. The free TROYPOINT App with Rapid App Installer makes this a breeze and works extremely well on the NVIDIA SHIELD.

Plex has teamed up with NVIDIA and they allow for users to run a home media server on this system. This allows for simple media sharing among all of your devices and even when you're away from home. For the serious Plex users, you can upgrade to the NVIDIA SHIELD Pro Model which includes 500 GB of internal storage. This isn't necessary though due to the fact that the NVIDIA SHIELD also allows for external storage by way of USB ports.

In full disclosure, I have not used the Plex Media Server on the NVIDIA SHIELD but it is something that I intend on doing in a future tutorial. I personally use Plex on my Windows 10 PC as of now.

Netflix and Prime Video play in full resolution on the NVIDIA SHIELD. This is not the case for generic Android TV Boxes running stock Android. If you're a big Netflix or Amazon Prime user, this is the perfect streaming box for you.

NVIDIA has done an outstanding job of pushing updates to this device. The update process is simple and they alert you whenever a new update is available or you can set it to auto-update in the settings panel.

I like the remote control that comes with the NVIDIA SHIELD. I also use an air mouse remote control that includes a keyboard for the apps that I sideload that don't work well with Android TV.

There are many more features that I admire about the NVIDIA SHIELD and these are just the highlights.

What I Dislike.

Unfortunately, there aren't as many applications available in the Google Play Store as you will find on an Android phone or tablet. This is due to

the fact that these apps must be optimized for the television screen or else Google won't allow them into the Android TV version of the store. Yes, this is a disappointment but keep in mind that you can still sideload everything that you need.

The NVIDIA SHIELD doesn't come with an HDMI cord. You would think that spending this type of money on an Android TV Box would provide you with everything that you need to get setup quickly. If you buy one of these, don't forget to purchase an HDMI cord.

The price is high and this is my main complaint. Most cord cutters looking for free or inexpensive media won't be willing to drop over \$150 on a streaming box.

NVIDIA SHIELD TV Download Speed Tests.

Download speed is one of the most important features to test due to the fact that we're streaming large HD files through these devices.

The following tests were conducted through my 200 Mbps Internet service. The WiFi testing was done through the 5 GHz band on my Asus AC3100 router.

The VPN that I am using in this speed test is IPVanish which is the fastest VPN available on the market today. I used the Speed Test tool within the TROYPOINT App to conduct the testing.

Ethernet.

VPN On: 101.7 Mbps download & 37.36 Mbps upload.

VPN Off: 266.8 Mbps download & 52.32 Mbps upload.

WiFi.

VPN On: 98.6 Mbps download & 32.55 Mbps upload.

VPN Off: 166.6 Mbps download & 43.62 Mbps upload.

If you are using a VPN, the NVIDIA SHIELD is one of the best devices that you can get due to excellent download speeds. Running a VPN requires processing power and this is why we see such high download speeds with the SHIELD when VPN is activated.

Is the NVIDIA SHIELD Worth Buying?

When it comes to the purchase decision of whether or not to buy the 2nd Generation NVIDIA SHIELD, there are multiple factors to consider and it is highly based on a user's preference.

Listed below are TROYPOINT's recommendations that you should consider when deciding to purchase a NVIDIA SHIELD.

Yes you should buy the NVIDIA SHIELD if:

You are an avid streamer of Movies & TV Shows and require the powerful processor. You use a VPN while streaming. You are a video game enthusiast. You prefer quality and power over price. You enjoy Google products. You are a fan of the Android TV Operating System.

No you should not buy the NVIDIA SHIELD if:

The \$179.00 price point is too high for you. You only stream Movies or TV Shows once in a while. You just want a streaming device to watch Netflix. You don't prefer Google products. You don't prefer the Android TV Operating System.

NVIDIA SHIELD is Overkill for Most Cord Cutters.

It's important to point out that the NVIDIA SHIELD is overkill for most people. You can usually achieve everything that you want to do with an Amazon Fire TV Stick 4K for a fraction of the price.

This is how I look at it. A Tesla will get me from point A to point B the same way that my Ford Focus will, but the Tesla will be more comfortable. You can think of the NVIDIA SHIELD as the Tesla and my Ford Focus as the Firestick in this example.
