What to Know.

In the Chrome Settings menu, select Advanced > Downloads > Location > Change and select a new location. To specify a location each time, go to Settings > Advanced > Downloads > Ask where to save each file before downloading . To find a download, go to Menu > Downloads .

This article explains how to change the Chrome default download folder, find a downloaded file, be prompted for where to save files, and adjust multiple file download permissions on a desktop Windows PC or Mac.

How to Change Chrome's Default Download Folder.

When you download files with the Google Chrome web browser, Chrome saves those files to a specific file folder. You can change this default download location to organize your downloads, free up space on your hard drive, or redirect downloaded files to an online storage service, such as Dropbox. It's also possible to set up Chrome to ask you for a download location each time you download a file. To change the Chrome default download location:

Open Chrome and select the menu icon (the three vertical dots), and then choose Settings .

Select Advanced in the left pane.

Select Downloads .

Next to Location , select Change .

Navigate to the folder you want to use as the default download folder, then choose Select . Now, when you use Chrome to download a file, it is saved in the newly specified folder.

How to Find a File Downloaded From Chrome.

To find where Chrome downloaded a file, open the searchable list of downloaded files. To access this list:

Open Chrome and select the menu icon (the three vertical dots), then choose Downloads .

The keyboard shortcut is Ctrl + J (on Windows) or Option + Command + L (on a Mac).

A list of downloaded files and associated URLs display. To open a file, select the filename. It opens in your computer's default application for the file type.

To delete a file, select the X next to the filename. It is removed from your list of downloaded files.

Have Chrome Ask Where to Save a File.

To bypass the default download folder and specify where to save files each time you download:

Open Chrome and select the menu icon (the three vertical dots), and then choose Settings .

At the bottom of the screen, select Advanced .

Select Downloads .

Turn on the Ask where to save each file before downloading toggle. Chrome now asks you for a download location each time you download a file.

How to Change Multiple File Download Permissions in Chrome.

To adjust whether Chrome asks if you want to download multiple files from the same website:

Open Chrome and select the menu icon (the three vertical dots), and then choose Settings .

Select Privacy and security from the menu on the left.

Select Site Settings under Privacy and Security.

Scroll down to Permissions and select the down arrow next to Additional permissions .

Select Automatic downloads .

Turn on the Ask when a site tries to download files automatically after the first file toggle.

Chrome now asks permission before downloading multiple files from a single site.

How Do You Change Windows' Default Download Path?

The default download location on our Windows systems works well enough most of the time without a problem, but what if you want or need to change the location at the system level? With that in mind, today's SuperUser Q&A post has some helpful advice for a frustrated reader.

Today's Question & Answer session comes to us courtesy of SuperUser—a subdivision of Stack Exchange, a community-driven grouping of Q&A web sites.

The Question.

SuperUser reader Dr. John A Zoidberg wants to know how to change the Windows' default download path:

I would like to keep my drive paths as clean as possible and C:\Downloads is much nicer than C:\Users\Myname\Downloads . How can I stop Windows 10 from using the user name profile location by default?

How do you change Windows' default download path?

The Answer.

SuperUser contributors Techie007 and Charles Burge have the answer for us. First up, Techie007:

1. Open Windows Explorer
2. Create the folder you want to have as your new Downloads folder (i.e. C:\Downloads)
3. Under This PC , right-click Downloads
4. Click Properties
5. Select the Location Tab
6. Click Move
7. Select the folder you made in Step 2
8. Once it has finished copying everything to the new folder, click OK to close the Properties Window.

Followed by the answer from Charles Burge:

It is not Windows itself that downloads files, but rather its applications like web browsers or other network clients. If you are specifically talking about downloading files from the Internet, your web browser has a setting for the default download location. You can even set it to ask you each time where you want to put a file that you are about to download.

Easily Change the Default Download Location in Windows 10.

On Windows computer, the default download location is set in Windows system drive (C drive), where many web browsers store downloading files there by default. Is it possible to change the default download location in Windows 10 ? And how to can we do it? You can get three ways to change where downloads go in Windows 10.

Way 1: Change Location of Downloads Folder in Windows Downloads Settings.

It is the most direct way to change the location of the Downloads folder. Everyone can finish it in minutes.

Step 1: Make a new download folder at the destination location, such as D drive.

Step 2: Open This PC and right-click Downloads folder to select the Properties option. If you don't see Downloads folder in This PC, double click Folders and you can see it on the list.

Step 3: Hit the Location tap and then click the Move... button.

Step 4: After that, you are able to select a destination for the download files. You can head to the new download folder you created in step 1 and click Select Folder to continue.

Step 5: Click the Apply button to apply the change. Afterward, you will get a prompt that asks to move all of the files from the old location to the new location. It is highly recommended to choose the Yes button.

Now, all contents of the previous download folder have been moved from C drive to the new location. And in the future, the files downloaded from the Internet will also be kept in this location.

Way 2: Change Where Downloads Go in Storage Settings.

The storage settings can help you to change the default save location for various file types in Windows 10. You can set the new download location

for new apps, new documents and new images, and so on.

Step 1: Access Settings > System> Storage in Windows 10.

Step 2: In the Storage windows, select Change where new content is saved in More Storage Settings filed.

Step 3: Set the default location for various files (new apps, new documents, new music and etc.) It is better not to define the location in local disk C.

Way 3: Change Default Download Path via iSunshare System Genius.

There is a good alternative for you to change all browser default download path and move all files—use iSunshare System Genius to finish the changes. iSunshare System Genius is the Windows optimization tool that helps you to maintain smooth performance in Windows. You can change the default download path within simple clicks in minutes.

Step 1: Launch the software and select the System Disk.

Step 2: Click the Downloads Transfer tab and then select the new download folder on another drive as the target location.

Step 3: After that, select the files that you want to move to the new locations. And if you do not make a choice, all contents will be selected by default. Finally, you can click the Move button to perform the change.

Minutes later, you will get the migration completed message. And you can close the software. This change will come into effect in the next time when you open the computer. Henceforth, all downloaded files will be saved in the new location.

And here is a step-by-step video guide about how to change download folder in Windows 10.

Change the Default Downloads Folder Path (Location) on Windows.

As we all know every Windows comes with default folders, we call them “Personal folders” as they are located inside the User’s folder (e.g C:\Users\pc). Each user have his own folders, and “Downloads” folder is one of them!

Well, if you have a secondary storage drive then moving your Downloads folder to that drive will help you save some space and keep your operating system’ drive (e.g C:) for apps only.

Actually you can move any personal folder (e.g Images, Documents, Videos, ...) – not only Downloads – to any directory you want using this method – if you like.

The “Screenshots” folder in Windows 10 is a good example of such a folder. You can take screenshots in Windows 10 via the Win + PrntScrn key and they save to the Screenshots folder. Another auto-folder in Windows is the Downloads folder. This is where apps download files to by default. You can select a different location for saving files but it doesn’t change the default Downloads folder path in Windows. Here’s how to do it.

Change the Directory of Downloads Folder on Windows.

1. How to Change the Default Downloads Folder Path.

Open the “File Explorer” ( Windows + E ) and right-click on the “Downloads” folder in the navigation column. Choose “Properties” from the context menu.

Go to “Location” tab in the “Downloads Properties” window. Click on the “Move” button and select a different folder to use as the default downloads folder. Click “Apply”.

In my case, I wanted to move the “Downloads” folder to another drive (E:), so I created a new folder named “Downloads” a selected it then clicked “Select Folder”.

Now you will be asked if you want to move the existing files to the new path, click “Yes”.

Wait for the copying to complete and never.

If you want to go back to the default path, it’s easy! Open File Explorer again ( Win + E ) and right-click Downloads in the navigation bar. Select Properties from the context menu and go to “Location” tab. Under the location field you will find the button “Restore Default”. Click it and Windows will return the downloads folder to the default location.

And there you have it!

How to change default downloads folder location in Windows 10.

When we download a file using any Web Browser (Internet Explorer, Microsoft Edge, Mozilla Firefox, Google Chrome, Opera, Safari etc.). It will be automatically downloaded into default Downloads folder in Windows 7, 8.1, 10. Default Downloads folder doesn't create any problem and Works well without any issue for all web browsers and downloading softwares such as IDM (Internet Download Manager).

However, we can change download folder location individually by changing download file location in any browser and software-app. But What if you want to change default file download path for all Web browsers, softwares and apps in Windows 10.

Yes, we can change default download folder at the system level. So all Internet Web Browsers, Softwares, and apps will automatically follow system level settings and will automatically change download folder location according to your System Download folder location settings.

Change default Downloads Folder in Windows 10.

If you want to change default downloads folder location in Windows 10 at the system level follow the steps below:

Open Windows File Explorer and right-click on Download available in the left tree. Now context menu will appear to choose Properties from the menu. Downloads Properties dialog box will appear, Change the Downloads folder location according to your need. By default it is set to C:\Users\username\Downloads and you can easily change it by entering a location eg C:\Downloads or other drive folder location E:\Downloads etc. If you want to select folder manually then you can use Move.. button. After clicking on Move.. you can choose the choose location where you want to save default download files. And here it is not necessary to give name Downloads you give other alternate names as you wish. After changing folder name or location click on OK button.

Now you have been successfully changed Downloads folder name or file store location in Windows 10.
