Delete the tracks that won't play from your library without hiding from your purchase history. Redownload using the cloud links that should remain, or close iTunes and reopen if they don't show up straight away. While downloading click the activity widget and turn off the option that allows for simultaneous downloads.

Question: Q: Song files bought from iTunes are corrupted.

I recently bought two albums on iTunes, and in each case, there was a problem with one of the tracks.

In the case of the first album - "Malibu" by Anderson .Paak - the song "The Bird" was asking for iTunes authorization. I put in my account details, but it just skips to the next song and asks again when I try again. I checked the song info and the for some inexplicable reason, the song is listed as an "AAC audio file" (whereas every other song is listed as a "Purchased AAC audio file") and it is purchased by a different variation of my name ("Sameer Nair" instead of "Rahul S Nair", but with the same email ID). I don't understand how any of that could happen, considering I bought the album together and it all downloaded at once. I have tried removing the file from iTunes and re-importing it but the result is the same.

In the case of the second album - "Redemption" by Jay Rock - the song "King's Dead" plays for 3 seconds, then skips to the next song. Again, I tried removing the file and re-importing it but the result is the same. I tried playing the song file on VLC - it played the first 3 seconds followed by silence for the rest of the duration of the song.

There seems to be no reason for either of these problems. All the songs in the album downloaded at the same time, and obviously, through the same account. Not sure what the solution is.

How to Completely Uninstall iTunes on Windows 10.

iTunes has always been a popular choice for Windows users looking to organize and listen to their music library. But, it also has numerous errors and some of which can be traced to the reason but some cannot. So, you may want to uninstall iTunes from Windows 10/8/7 completely. Part 3. How to Manually Uninstall iTunes and Apple Related Software.

Below are the manual steps to uninstall iTunes completely and other Apple software components:

Step 1: Go to " Control Panel > Programs and Features " on your Windows 10. All your PC programs will be shown there.

Step 2: Type "Apple" into the search bar and enter. This filters all the software related to Apple. You would see 6 or 5 programs there.

Step 3: Right click on each program and select Uninstall . You should do the uninstall following the order we mentioned in Part 1.

Note: If the user uninstalls these components in a different order or uninstalls only a few components, then it may have unplanned effects.

The users need not to worry about the songs they have purchased from iTunes store or imported from the CD. They will be saved in the "My Music Folder" even if you remove the iTunes completely. However, it is advisable to take the Backup of the iTunes library. The users can also do a backup of the iTunes by copying the library to external hard drive.

Moreover, the removal and reinstalling of the iTunes may take a large amount of time to complete the process, but it solely depends on the performance of your PC device.

How to Verify iTunes is Completely Uninstalled.

Mostly, the removal of iTunes and its related components from the Control Panel will remove all the supporting files. However, in few cases, some files may be left behind so the user needs to confirm the removal of all the folders through:

C:\Program Files\Bonjour C:\Program Files\Common Files\Apple (The user needs to restart the computer to remove this folder as the computer system may keep the user away from removing this folder) C:\Program Files\iTunes C:\Program Files\iPod C:\Program Files\QuickTime C:\Windows\System32\QuickTime C:\Windows\System32\QuickTimeVR.

In case, the user has 64-bit version of the Windows then folders need to remove too:

C:\Program Files (x86)\Bonjour C:\Program Files (x86)\Common Files\Apple C:\Program Files (x86)\iTunes C:\Program Files (x86)\iPod C:\Program Files (x86)\QuickTime C:\Windows\SysWOW64\QuickTime C:\Windows\SysWOW64\QuickTimeVR.

This wikiHow teaches you how to remove iTunes from your computer, along with the accompanying Apple services. Removing iTunes is pretty straightforward on a Windows PC, but since iTunes is the default player for many files on your Mac and is considered an integral part of the operating system, it's not easy (or recommended) to delete the app. It is, however, possible.

Remove all downloads from iTunes? (But keep them in iCloud)

I have a mixture of local music that I added myself to iTunes, along with albums added through Apple Music. Fortunately, iTunes recognizes this and allows me to "Remove Download" for the songs I added manually to iTunes. So all my songs effectively behave like Apple Music "songs."

I'm wondering if there's a way to batch-remove all downloads from iTunes to free of some disk space, since I can stream non-downloaded songs anyway.

2 Answers 2.

In iTunes 12.6, under Music , select Songs and sort by iCloud Status . If that column is missing, right-click the column headers and tick iCloud Status .

Select all songs with a status of Apple Music by clicking the first one, holding \diamond shift , and selecting the last one. Then right-click and select Remove Download . Repeat for all songs with a status of Matched , Uploaded and Purchased .

In fact you can simply select the first song with a status of Matched , hold \diamond shift , then select the last song with a status of Uploaded . This is true in particular if you use iTunes Match rather than MUSIC .

The songs you want to leave on disk are marked as Duplicate and Ineligible .

The simplest and quickest way is to setup a new iTunes library. This will ONLY work if you have Apple iTunes Music Match purchased . Otherwise do NOT attempt this process.

Close iTunes. Move your existing iTunes library to another location on your drive (DON'T DELETE!). Re-Open iTunes, and you should now get a message like.

The folder "iTunes" cannot be found or created, and is required. The default location for this folder is inside the "Music" folder.

The MAJOR DRAWBACK to this method is that you will have removed any videos, books, apps or anything else stored as part of your iTunes library. These should also all resynchronize with your iTunes library, if you want to download them. Otherwise they will be stored on the Apple cloud and you'll have to re-download them. This does NOT include any videos, audio books, or other files that you might have "ripped" that were not acquired from Apple. You will lose these files if you don't move them from your older iTunes Library to the new one.

If you are happy with the way this turns out, then you can just start using the new library and get rid of the old one. MAKE SURE you have all the files you want in the new library BEFORE deleting the old one.

Otherwise you can trash the NEW iTunes library, and move your old one back.

ALTERNATIVELY: You can go into the iTunes library folder, open the iTunes Music folder, and then delete all the music folders, while leaving the Movies, TV Shows, Podcasts, and iTunes U folders. AGAIN, you must have Apple iTunes Music Match purchased for this to work.
