Due to the request from some of our Governors, the deadline for items to be sent to PI HQ for the district shelves in the Heritage Library has been extended to March 15, 2021. Committee Members will be in Macon, GA, soon after that to display the items sent for the Districts' shelves. We want each district shelf to shine! Need ideas? How about Pilot memorabilia, framed photos of your District's project or of milestones for your district?

The Committee is making progress on plans for convention, development of the history book, and the organization of the Archives Room.

We are collaborating with President Peggy on plans for the Service Project and will meet again with local representatives to make it happen. As you may remember, the project of providing needed supplies for local schools is similar to the original service project provided for schools by the Pilot Club of Macon, Georgia. We are asking that clubs and individuals contribute \$50 to provide supplies for a classroom. You may choose to provide supplies for more than one classroom, of course. We plan to include a list of all classroom service project contributors in the Convention Program. Checks may be sent to PI and earmarked "Service Project."

Pilot Clubs and individuals are asked to participate in the International Service Project at convention in Atlanta. Through you, our organization is hoping to Touch 1,000 Lives! For each \$50 contributed, a teacher in the Bibb County School District will receive a box of needed school supplies.

Also, during the 2021-2022 Pilot year, Pilot Clubs and Districts are encouraged to provide a service project that will Touch 100 Lives. In this effort, Pilot International has developed a document with suggestions for service projects and a template for a press release.

Please save the date of Monday, October 18, 2021. A special luncheon is being planned to celebrate the 100-year anniversary of the chartering of Pilot International. It will be held at the historic Terminal Station in Macon, Georgia. This site was chosen because the railroad was the mode of transportation for many Pilots to attend the early conventions in the 1920's and 1930's. Remember that Pearl Sparks composed the Code of Ethics while riding a train to convention. More details will be forthcoming...for now, just "Save the Date!"

Foundation history.

At the 1917 convention, outgoing Rotary president Arch Klumph proposed setting up an endowment “for the purpose of doing good in the world.” That one idea, and an initial contribution of \$26.50, set in motion a powerful force that has transformed millions of lives around the globe.

Financial structure.

The Rotary Foundation is organized as a public charity operated exclusively for charitable purposes and governed by a Board of Trustees. The operations of Rotary International, a member organization, are overseen by its Board of Directors.

The headquarters of Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation are in Evanston, Illinois, USA. We have associate foundations in Australia, Brazil, Canada, Germany, India, Japan, and the United Kingdom.

Brain Safety & Health.

In 2013, Pilot formally narrowed this service focus to Encouraging Brain Safety and Health as the majority of our clubs’ work centers in this area.

Grass-roots, local safety-related initiatives are the heart of Pilot International’s Brain and Safety Fitness service mission and are championed by Pilot and Anchor worldwide.

Pilot Club participate in their community’s local safety fairs and often host bike rodeos where club members have the opportunity to present BrainMinders™ and discuss the importance of brain safety with participating children. Some clubs also present each attendee with a free, new bike helmet, often provided through matching grant funds from the Pilot International Founders Fund or through donations or grants from major corporations.

Pilot International is proud to work with Safe Kids Worldwide, a global organization dedicated to preventing injuries in children, the number one killer of kids in the United States. Pilot International and Safe Kids Worldwide share a common mission: to educate children about safety, promote awareness about injury prevention and provide support for those who have suffered from traumatic brain injury or loss due to the same. Pilot, Anchor, and Compass Clubs support the efforts of local Safe Kids Coalitions by participating in Safe Kids initiatives such as Nation Safe Kids Day, Safe Kids’ distracted pedestrian campaign and other injury-prevention and education endeavors.

To further Pilot’s efforts to educate young people about the need for brain-safe practices, Pilot International also supports BrainMinders™.

Pilot’s signature family of brain-safety educational programs. Many clubs perform the BrainMinders™ Buddie skits for local elementary-aged students, and the BrainMinders™ “Be Mindful” campaign offers Anchor Club International members an opportunity to model thoughtful behavior and encourage personal responsibility within their own schools. The “What Where You Thinking?” BrainMinders program educates middle and high-school students about the need for brain-safe practices in areas of specific interest to them such as team sports, biking, skateboarding, texting and driving, etc. – and the consequences that occur if they don’t.

Our History.

Pilot International was chartered on October 18, 1921 in Macon, Georgia, U.S.A. by Elizabeth Leonard and forty local business women. The name “Pilot” was inspired by the mighty riverboat pilots of that day who represented leadership and guidance.

Pilot Principles: Friendship and Service Motto: “True Course Ever” Colors: Green (life and vigor) and Gold (sincerity of purpose) Emblem: A riverboat pilot’s wheel with eight spokes First Pilot President: Lucy B. Allen, elected at the organization’s first convention in 1922.

Pearl Sparks of Florence, Alabama wrote the Pilot Code of Ethics. It was first presented in 1926 at the 5th Annual PI Convention held in Montgomery, Alabama with 69 Pilots attending.

In 1929, Pilot organized its first club west of the Mississippi, the Pilot Club of El Paso, Texas. In 1932 the 22nd Pilot Club was organized in Juarez, Mexico, making Pilot a true “international” organization.

Ruby Newhall, President of Pilot International in 1949, first envisioned Anchor Clubs, Pilot’s youth service organization arm.

By 1954 the number of Pilot members had increased to 9,900. Membership hit an all time high of 20,877 in 1985.

The first issue of The Pilot Log was published in January 1924. Early issues were single page bulletins containing club news. Pearl Sparks, author of the Pilot Code of Ethics, once served as editor of The Pilot Log (1927-28).

Pilot International Foundation (now the Pilot International Founders Fund) was established in 1975 to further Pilot's humanitarian efforts. Since the Pilot International Founders Fund grant program began in 1977, nearly 1,500 grants totaling more than \$1.5 million have been disbursed to Pilot Clubs.
