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How to Play Minecraft Modpacks with Twitch.

Arguably one of the best things to come from Minecraft is the immense amount of modpacks that you can play that will alter the game and give you new fun experiences to enjoy. One of the best modpack launchers you can use to install and play these modpacks with is the Twitch App. The Twitch App provides a wide range of popular modpacks that include RLcraft, All The Mods 5, and Sky Factory 4 just to name a few. These Minecraft modpacks can be tricky to install manually which is why it is recommended to use a modpack launcher to do all the heavy lifting for you. The Twitch App takes all the fun modpacks you can find on Curseforge and places them in an easy to install launcher for you. In this guide, we are going to take a look at how you can install the Twitch App and your favorite modpacks with it.

How to play modpacks with Twitch.

Java Installation.

The first thing you will want to do is check that you have Java installed on your computer. This can be done using this verification tool. (Does not work in Chrome or Edge) If you are needing to install or update your Java version you can do so from here. Once Java is installed/updated be sure to reboot your computer.

Twitch App/Modpack Installation.

You will want to sign up for a Twitch account if you do not already have one. Once you have a Twitch account you are finally ready to install the launcher and your desired modpacks.

First you will want to install the Twitch App for your desired operating system. Once installed you will be prompted to login to your Twitch account. After logging in, locate the Mods tab at the top of the program and select it. Then click Minecraft on that page. You will now see your Minecraft Modpack page in the Twitch launcher. Here you can select Browse Modpacks. You will be able to search for the modpack you prefer in the search bar. Once you find the desired modpack you can hover over it and click the install button that pops up over the modpacks icon. It will run through the installation process and show you its current progress in the installation. After it has completed you can find the newly created modpack profile in your My Modpacks tab. On this page, you can just click Play under the specific modpack to start launching the modpack. This will then open up the Minecraft launcher where you can see in the bottom left the modpack is selected. Finally hit play in the Minecraft launcher to start loading the modpack!

Common Issues.

Minecraft not installed.

In some cases, if you head to the Mods tab you may see the Minecraft selection is faded. Select this and it will prompt you to install Minecraft. You can simply just click install and the Twitch App will pull a version of Minecraft and install it for you. Once done it should take you to the correct section for Minecraft mods.

Outdated Modpack.

If your modpack has an update available to install you will see a small button to the left of the Play button. Select this and double-check the latest version is selected at the top and then hit Continue. This will automatically update the pack to the latest version. You will then want to make sure you update your server as well.

FTB Modpack Outdated.

If you want to play a Feed the Beast modpack you may find that you are unable to join your server. This is likely caused by an out of date Modpack on the client side. Twitch is no longer partnered with Feed the Beast so new updates to modpacks are no longer available on the Twitch App. You will need to install the FTB App in order to get the latest version of these Modpacks.

2. Click Install when prompted.
3. Log in with your Twitch account.
4. Click Mods at the top, then select Minecraft. Click Install.
5. You can now browse modpacks and create modpack profiles.

How to install modpacks on the Twitch launcher: 1. Install the Twitch launcher on your desktop using the tutorial above.

2. Click on Mods at the top.

3. Select Browse Modpacks.
4. Select the modpack of choice then select Install.
5. Once installed, click Play to launch.

Note: Most modpacks require 4-8gbs of RAM in order to run properly. You can change the amount of dedicated RAM by clicking on your Profile>Settings>Minecraft then increasing the Allocated Memory bar to 4000-8000 MB's.

How to copy a Minecraft instance from Twitch to MultiMC.

Now why would I want to do that, some may ask. I believe that there are a variety of reasons to play using MultiMC instead:

You simply don't like the Twitch client and don't need the streaming features
You want to play a modpack with the Steam Controller
You want to allocate different amounts of RAM to each of your Minecraft instances
You want easy access to your singleplayer worlds and world seeds
You want a better overview over your screenshots
You want to easily create and export your custom mod packs to give them to your friends
You want a better console to analyze Minecraft client crashes
Etc etc ...

Sadly, simply copying an entire folder from Twitch to MultiMC won't work. This guide will help you with that.

- 1) First, open your Twitch launcher, then pick and choose the Modpack you would like to copy over to MultiMC. We will be using the Regrowth pack as an example.
- 2) Click on the "Play" button of that instance, which will open the Minecraft Launcher.
- 3) Click on "Play" in the Minecraft launcher in order to have the client download all game assets. Once the game has properly started, exit it. In the Twitch launcher, click on the image icon of the modpack ("View Profile") to see its details – we need to know the Minecraft version and Forge version later.
- 4) Leave this window open, then start MultiMC. Click the button at the top left to add a new instance.
- 5) In the menu that opens, you can click the icon (1) to set a different icon for your instance. Enter the desired name for the modpack in field (2), then click button (3) to choose the Minecraft version.
- 6) Choose the Minecraft version (1) that is identical with the version indicated on the modpack detail page in your Twitch client and confirm with OK (2).
- 7) Click on the new instance (1) you just created and launch it (2). This will download the required game assets. Wait until the game finishes downloading all assets and close it once you are in the main menu.
- 8) Click on "Edit Instance" (1).
- 9) Click on the "Version" tab (1) in the window that opens.
- 10) Click on "Install Forge" (1).
- 11) Choose exactly the same Forge version as indicated on the Twitch modpack page . If you pick the wrong version, your game may not launch properly.
- 12) Launch the game from MultiMC, then close it again.
- 13) Go to your Twitch Client. Click on Button (1), then on "Open Folder" (2) to access the folder folder of the modpack.
- 14) Mark all files and subfolders in that directory and copy everything

15) In MultiMC, select your instance and click on "Instance Folder" (1).

16) Open the "minecraft" folder in that directory and paste the previously copied files and folders in here. If you get an "overwrite" prompt, confirm that with "yes".

17) In the MultiMC main window, leftclick your instance once, then click on "Edit Instance". In the window that opens, click on "Settings" (1).

18) Check the box at "Memory" (2), then adjust the minimum and maximum memory allocation values (3). Most modpacks should run just fine with min-max values of 1024 – 4096 MB RAM, but your experience may vary. If loading takes unusually long, or if your game lags considerably, you may need to allocate more RAM in some cases.

And that's it, you're done! You can now launch the modpack from MultiMC. Have fun!

I can't launch any of the modpacks.

Details of the issue When I try to launch any of the modpacks, I get the message "The version you are trying to play inherits properties from an unknown version." There is no crash log, because it never even starts up. I have tried it on SevTech Ages, Forever Stranded, FTB Beyond, Project Ozone 2, FTB Pyramid Reborn, Farming Valley, and Forever Stranded 2. I'm guessing from that, that it's all the other packs as well. This has been going on ever since the Minecraft 1.12 update I think, at least 3 weeks. I would appreciate any ideas. Thanks.

Mac Can't launch any modpacks.

When I first downloaded the FTB launcher .jar about six months ago, I could run every modpack, but now I can't run any of them. The FTB Ultimate pack just vanishes, but the BMP actually gives me a crash log. I'm not sure what to include, but the error screen tells me to show someone the crash log .txt file instead of a screenshot of the Minecraft crash screen.

I'm running Mac OS X 10.8.5 on an Early 2011 MBP 2.7 GHz i7 with 8 GB of ram. I could just run FTB on Windows, but I'd really rather not reboot just to play Minecraft. / What should I do to get this to work? Anything else I need to include to help?
