Console gaming is at an all-time high this generation. With the introduction of online gaming and having your console connected to the Internet, suddenly countless possibilities open up. One perk of this breakthrough is the constant updating of the system software of your Sony console. These updates keep your PS4 experience fresh, and it can also offer more stability to your console. If you don't have an internet connection, you can download the update to a USB drive and use that to update your PS4. This wikiHow teaches you how to update your PS4.

PS4 Firmware 7.55 Available for Download Now.

As of today, PS4 firmware 7.55 can be downloaded from the PlayStation Network. At the same time, server problems plague numerous players. Apparently there is a stable connection now.

PlayStation Network has been causing problems for players for a few hours. On the global networks, they complain that it is impossible for them to start games that require a server connection. Apparently there were problems checking licenses, so that many digital games cannot start as planned.

The error codes are often mentioned in this context:

CE-32899-1 NP-34957-8 NP-39226-2 CE-30035-1.

The error message CE-30035-1 appears, for example, when trying to restore the licenses manually, which is hardly possible due to the faulty server connection.

Sony did not give reasons for the problems. The company also indicates on the official PSN status page that all services are running as usual.

The server problems in the PSN may have something to do with the PS4 firmware 7.55. This was published surprisingly today. If you are one of the affected players, it might help to download and install the latest software. The new PS4 firmware is apparently not yet offered automatically. So you can start the download manually:

Click on the main menu for the settings. There you will discover the point "System Software Update". After one-click, follow the instructions. After the download, you will start the actual installation.

The changelog for the PS4 firmware 7.55 is very straightforward. It just says that the new software patch improves the system software and performance.

PS4 Firmware Update 7.50 Is Available To Download Now [Update]

Sony has released a brand new PS4 firmware update 7.50 today. This was in an early beta testing phase for a while and has been made public today.

The new PS4 firmware update is roughly 471 MB. It should be available to download now starting from today. The official support page still has the old version listed so it appears Sony is a little behind the curve when it comes to updating the website.

This system software update improves system performance.

Sony had released a beta firmware update for the PS4 early in March. They were testing out 7.50 firmware with a beta test which appears to have made an important change for HDMI devices. The new firmware has implemented a new HDMI standard which should help with the newer technology.

Most of these updates appear to aim at improving the system stability or implementing minor new features like the aforementioned HDCP update that was also available in the beta test of this new firmware. There are usually under-the-hood changes as well but it is hard to determine them since Sony hasn't detailed them so far.

PS4 Firmware Version 7.55 Available for Download.

Gamers can now download the 7.55 firmware to their PlayStation 4 consoles. As is often the case, the new software update focuses exclusively on

system performance.

Sony has released a software update for PlayStation 4. Firmware version 7.55 weighs 471.4MB and can be downloaded either from the console or as a file via the official support website. According to the manufacturer, the update only improves system performance. For real novelties (such as two-stage login verification), we will have to wait for version 8.00.

Find out how to 'factory reset' your PlayStation® console using Safe Mode options 6 and 7. These steps delete all user data and reinstall the PlayStation firmware.

Important!

Safe Mode option 7 (Reinstall System Software) will delete all data on your PlayStation console and will also replace the system software. Selecting this option should be considered as the last step when troubleshooting.

Before you reset, have you tried these steps?

Reinstall PS5 and PS4 system software.

Using a PC or Mac, create a folder named "PS5" on a USB drive formatted as FAT32. Inside that folder, create another folder named "UPDATE".

Visit the PS5 system software update page and select the "Reinstall system software" section. Download the installation file and save it in the "UPDATE" folder. Save the file as "PS5UPDATE.PUP".

Plug the USB drive containing the file into the PS5 system.

Start the PS5 console in Safe Mode: press and hold the power button, releasing after the second beep.

Select Safe Mode option 7: Reinstall System Software .

Select Update from USB Storage Device > OK .
