By studying the Indiana motorcycle manual, you will take a big step in obtaining your Indiana motorcycle endorsement. The motorcycle manual can help you get a better understanding of the operation of your motorcycle, gear and equipment, as well as alcohol and its effects on motorcycle riding.

Indiana Motorcycle Manual.

The Indiana Motorcycle Operator Manual (BMV0005), available through the Indiana Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV), is loaded with information you need to know in order to become a legal and safe motorcycle rider.

The contents of the motorcycle manual include:

Information on how to get your motorcycle endorsement. Guides to properly handling common and emergency situations on your bike. A guide to the proper gear and equipment you need to operate your motorcycle. Information on the effects of alcohol, marijuana, and fatigue on your ability to ride.

Indiana Motorcycle Endorsement.

In Indiana, you must get a motorcycle endorsement on your driver's license in order to operate a motorcycle. You can get your motorcycle endorsement by way of one of the following avenues:

Learner's permit. Indiana Motorcycle Operator Safety Education Program.

Learner's Permit.

If you choose this route to get your motorcycle endorsement, you must have a valid driver's license and:

Pass a vision screening test . Pass a knowledge test based on information provided in the manual. To ensure you pass on the first time, take a motorcycle practice test and get familiar with the types of questions you'll see.

With the above completed, you will be awarded a motorcycle learner's permit. Use your learner's permit to safely practice operating your motorcycle.

Once you are ready, schedule a motorcycle riding skills test. Passing this test will complete your eligibility requirements for your motorcycle endorsement.

Motorcycle Operator Safety Education Program

Upon completion of a Basic Rider Course , you will be eligible for your motorcycle endorsement.

This course takes place both in a classroom setting and on a motorcycle. You do not need a permit to take this course, and are exempt from the motorcycle skills test once have successfully completed the course. Note.

Operating Your Motorcycle in Indiana.

In the Indiana DMV motorcycle handbook you can find information on how to legally and safely operate your motorcycle. Through studying the manual you will learn about the following topics:

Basic vehicle control. Gear shifting. Braking. Turning. Proper lane positions. Proper and safe distances between you and other vehicles. Passing. Merging. Sharing lanes. And more.

Gear and Equipment.

You can refer to the motorcycle manual to gain a better understanding of your motorcycle gear and equipment, such as:

DOT-compliant helmets. Face and eye protection. Gloves. Hearing protection. Protective clothing. Basic motorcycle controls.

Alcohol, Drugs, and Motorcycles.

Finally, the IN motorcycle handbook contains information on the effects alcohol and marijuana use can have on your ability to safely operate your motorcycle.

Riding drunk is very dangerous and against the law. Be safe. Don't get on your bike drunk.

To learn about how drugs, alcohol, and fatigue can affect your riding ability, see the DMV motorcycle manual.

In Indiana, the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) provides driving manuals to help you become a safer driver, including the IN driver's handbook, motorcycle handbook, and commercial driver's manual. For information about traffic and vehicle laws, view the Indiana Vehicle Code.

Several driving handbooks are available from the IN BMV, including a driver's manual for new drivers and new residents. Special DMV handbooks are also available for commercial drivers and motorcycle operators.

Indiana Driver's Manual.

The Indiana Driver's Manual is available for download from the IN BMV. This is the best DMV manual for new drivers and new Indiana residents who are not applying for a special license, such as a commercial license.

The handbook covers traffic laws, safe driving practices, and other driving techniques such as:

Operating a vehicle safely. Traffic signs and signals. What to do if you have a tire blowout. How to complete a written accident report.

You'll also find driver's license information in the driving manual, including:

How to apply for a learner's permit and driver's license in Indiana. or replacing an IN driver's license. Driving record points and violations. Driver safety programs. How to drive in extreme weather conditions.

The Indiana BMV driver's manual is the basis for the written knowledge test you'll take to get a learner's permit or driver's license.

Before you take the written test, you should read and study the DMV handbook to help you prepare. You'll also find sample questions to help you practice and test your knowledge of the concepts covered in the driver's manual.

Commercial Driver's Manual.

Before applying for an IN commercial driver license (CDL), you'll need to study the Indiana CDL Manual (Form SP 283), a driver's handbook specifically for CDL applicants.

The commercial driving manual covers CDL rules and driving skills, including:

Safety rules. Transporting passengers. Carrying hazardous materials. Air brakes. Combination vehicles. Pulling trailers. Tank vehicles. School buses.

The DMV handbook for commercial drivers also explains:

How to apply for a CDL. The CDL skills (road) tests and knowledge (written) tests.

Finally, the Indiana commercial driving manual contains a series of sample questions you might find on the written test. Sample questions are a great way to determine how well you've learned the information in the DMV handbook.

For a more complete review of the commercial driver's handbook, you can take an online CDL practice test.

NOTE: If you are new to Indiana, you may also want to read the IN driver's manual for an overview of state traffic laws.

IN Motorcycle Operator Manual.

Read the Indiana BMV Motorcycle Operator Manual (BMV0005) to learn how to apply for your motorcycle license and safely operate your motorcycle on Indiana roads.

The motorcycle driving manual covers both general motorcycle operation and motorcycle safety practices.

Some of the motorcycle driving skills in the handbook include:

Using correct hand signals. Basic vehicle control (braking, avoiding crashes, turns, shifting, etc.)

Safety is heavily emphasized in the DMV manual for motorcycles to ensure that prospective riders understand the potential hazards of motorcycles and know how to handle them. The motorcycle driver's handbook covers safety topics like:

Riding under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Carrying passengers. How to avoid flying objects.

You'll also find licensing information in the DMV handbook, which explains how to add a motorcycle endorsement to your IN driver's license.

In addition to reading and studying the driver's manual for motorcycles, you may also find it help to take an online Indiana motorcycle practice test before taking the BMV test.

NOTE: If you're getting your first driver's license OR you're new to Indiana, you can also read the IN driving manual to learn more about traffic laws, road signs, and general driver's license procedures.

Vehicle Code in Indiana.

Read the Indiana Vehicle Code (Title 9. Motor Vehicles) for details about the vehicle and traffic laws covered in IN driving manuals, including:

Vehicle titling and registration. Vehicle classes and types. Disability placards. Traffic tickets.

The Vehicle Code is the collection of state laws that apply to driving and vehicles, and provides more depth and detail than DMV driver's handbooks.

If you were recently ticketed for a traffic violation, the Vehicle Code may be more helpful than a driving manual if you wish to research the violation to fight the charge. To learn how to respond to your traffic fine, visit our Traffic Tickets page.

Indiana BMV Test 50 Questions – Rules & Signs.

The passing rate in Indiana is just around 50%. It makes the BMV Test in Indiana one of the toughest in the country.

Therefore, you need to prepare well if you want to pass the first time.

Getting the most up-to-date version of the Indiana Driver's Manual is a must. You can get a hard copy from your nearest BMV location or driving school. If you want to help the environment, you can also download a PDF-version online at MyBMV.com.

Remember, you can find answers to all test questions in this manual.

Since the manual is full of detail, you should start by previewing and understanding the content in general. Then, move from general to detail – one chapter at the time.

Road Sign Recognition.

Road signs are an important part of your Indiana BMV Test. BMV will ask you to identify 16 signs by color, shape and/or symbols. You can only miss 2 of these signs.

It gives you a small margin for mistakes.

As an example, you must be able to tell the difference between Divided Highway Begins and Divided Highway Ends.

These two signs are not shown side-by-side in the Indiana Driver's Manual, which is why many test takers miss the important difference between the two.

Look at the illustration above and note where the divider is placed on the two signs.

Road Rules and Traffic Laws.

The second part of the Indiana license examination has 34 multiple-choice questions about important road rules and safe driving techniques. The margin for errors on this part is slightly better. You can miss six questions out of the 34 questions.

Besides asking what traffic signals and pavement markings mean, the Indiana BMV test focus on defensive driving and how you can avoid accidents. BMV wants to make sure that you know enough to be a safe driver. This includes awareness of the effects of alcohol and drugs on your driving.

Indiana Graduated License System

Like all states in United States, Indiana has a Graduated Driver's Licensing System. Such a system help new drivers build up driving experience and skills gradually over time and in a safe environment.

The first step in this program includes a learner's permit. With a driver education you can get your Indiana learner's permit when you are 15 years old. Without driver education, you must wait until you turn 16.

Your learner's permit is usually valid for two years. You must hold the permit for 180 days and complete 50 hours of supervised driving practice (of which 10 hours must be at night) before you can move on to the next step.

After the permit phase, BMV issues a Probationary License. With driver education, you must be 16 years 90 days old to get the Probationary License. Without driver education, you must be 16 years 270 days old.

Probationary License and Restrictions.

The Probationary License comes with some important restrictions.

For the first 180 days, you may not, with some exceptions, drive between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m.

During this period, there are also passenger restrictions. You may not drive unsupervised with any passengers unless passengers fall in a category of close relatives.

Probationary Driver's License holders are also prohibited from using any form of telecommunications device while driving unless the device is being used to make a 911 emergency call.

You should pay close attention to all restrictions.

You have a Probationary Driver's License until you are 21 years old.

The last step is a full, unrestricted Driver's License which BMV may issue after your 21st birthday. Since your Probationary Driver's License expires 30 days after your 21st birthday, you must renew to get your regular license.

Who Must Take the Indiana Knowledge Test?

You must pass a written knowledge test if you:

Apply for your first learner's permit
Become a new Indiana resident and hold an out-of-country driver's license
Let your Indiana driver's license expire for more than 180 days
Have six or more active points on an Indiana driving record and want to renew your driver's license.

As of July 2019, Indiana waives the knowledge test for new residents 18 years or older who hold an out-of-state driver's license.

If You are Adult.

In Indiana, all residents who apply for a driver's license the first time must start with a learner's permit, regardless of age. They must hold the permit for at least 180 days before BMV can issue an unrestricted driver's license.

During the permit phase, applicants must log at least 50 hours (10 hours at night) of supervised driving.

After 180 days, applicants must pass a vision test and driving skills test. With completed driver's education at an authorized driving school, the driving test is waived if you have passed the test at the driving school.
